## CUMC Updates

In our weekly video update this last Friday, Rev. David addressed the following points:



- We are tentatively planning to re-open in a lessened capacity on June 7th. Because this is a fluid situation, this date may change. Please keep connected with our social media streams and churchwide email.
- We will be offering an 8:30am Traditional Service on the Square, a 9:30am Traditional Service in the Poplar Sanctuary, and an 11am Modern Service in the Foundry.
- We encourage you to download the Church Center App in your app store in order to virtually "register" for which of our three services you'll attend. This is not a requirement to attend, it's just a tool for us to use in order to be prepared!
- When we do reopen, it will only be for in person worship, this does NOT include Sunday School, childcare, weekday programming, etc.
- We encourage you to follow these guidelines when planning to attend service:  
Take temperature readings of who are planning on attending service. If you or others in your household are running a temperature, please stay home.
- Observe social distancing from pew to parking lot and back.
- Wear a personal mask covering your mouth and nose in order to protect others and yourself from airborne particles. We will have masks available should you need one.
- Follow the Golden Rule!

## CUMC Missional Appointments for the 2020/2021 Conference Year

Bishop Bill McAlilly and the Nashville Area Cabinet of the Tennessee/Memphis made a covenant commitment this year to make appointments with "the mission of the Church as their first priority". They worked diligently and in good faith to fulfill this covenant as they made appointments in both conferences. As a result, our senior pastor Rev. David Atkinson and executive pastor Rev. Dr. Deborah Suddarth have been reappointed for the 2020/2021 conference year.



And as Rev. Dell King moves to a new appointment, CUMC will receive Rev. Tondala Hayward as our new associate pastor. She will lead us in worship for the first time on Sunday, August 2.

Rev. Hayward is a licensed Local Pastor who will be commissioned as a Provisional Elder at Annual Conference 2020. She is a licensed elementary teacher and taught students at Shelby County Schools, Youth Villages and Perea Preschool. She received a Bachelor of Science in Education with sociology minor from the University of Memphis, a Master of Arts in Elementary Education from the University of Phoenix, and a Master of Divinity from Memphis Theological Seminary.

Rev. Hayward currently serves as pastor at Longstreet United Methodist Church in Memphis. She is married to Alan Hayward, a chemical operator. They have two adult sons Justin (chemical engineer) and Jeremy (first responder). Her stepdaughter LaChasity (service expediter) has two daughters - Aaliyah and Kyla.

## Project Transformation

Project Transformation will not have any in-person camps this year and they are asking us to provide the supplies for 70 Camp-in-a-Bag that week. Most of these items can be found at the local dollar stores. There is a drop-off container in the vestibule inside entrance #4 bearing a Project Transformation sign. We would greatly appreciate your help in providing the following supplies, the numbers behind each item are needed per bag: *Bookmark (1), Journal or Composition Notebook with ruled pages (1), Pre-sharpened pencils (1 pack), Small pencil sharpener (1), Crayons (1 pack), Sidewalk chalk (1 box/bin), Snack (2-3 servings, no peanuts please) Examples: Pretzels, microwave popcorn, fruit snacks, granola bars, fruit cups, jerky.* The new books and tote bags have all been generously donated by church members.

Another Volunteer opportunity is to **Serve as a Pen Pal** with a Project Transformation student this summer. Each Pen Pal volunteer will be paired with a student, writing back and forth as the summer allows. This is a great opportunity to help our students grow in their literacy and writing skills from home! Letters will be mailed to the Project Transformation office where they will be reviewed and sent to the connected Pen Pal. (June 1 -July 23).



PT staff will virtually teach and help local children and families. They will provide interactive videos, online learning and reading, and provide daily lunches. CUMC will provide 2-3 people at Centenary UMC to help pass out drive-thru lunches provided by the SCS food program.
